Integrity Biofuels Hosts Senator Richard Lugar Morristown, IN – Integrity Biofuels

Saturday Senator Richard Lugar and several members of his staff visited Integrity Biofuels, central Indiana's first biodiesel production plant Saturday. While there the Senator presented Charles "Shorty" Whittington, president of Integrity Biofuels with the flag of the United States of America that was flown over the United States Capital at his request honoring Integrity Biofuels for their dedication and outstanding contribution to our nation's energy security through the promotion of renewable fuels.

Senator Lugar toured the production facility from start to finish. Including a briefing on the soybean oil processing plant operated next door by Bunge North America that supplies the feedstock for Integrity to produce soy biodiesel. He discussed that fact that soybeans from his own family farm are crushed at the Bunge plant and the bean oil is then shipped to Integrity Biofuels and processed into renewable fuel.

Charles "Shorty" Whittington, President of Integrity Biofuels, said "This is a good day for Integrity Biofuels and a significant day for the biodiesel industry. Senator Lugar is such a respected advocate for the growth and development of renewable fuels produced here in America. This was his first visit to a biodiesel production facility and we were proud to host him here at Integrity."

Following the tour the group headed to Knightstown, IN to the GasAmerica truck stop located at I-70 and State Road 109. The Senator then presented GasAmerica's CEO Stephanie White with the July 2007 Lugar Energy Patriot award. The Energy Patriot award is part of an ongoing effort by Senator Lugar to recognize professionals, scholars, students or businesses that demonstrate leadership and initiative in taking concrete action to reduce America's dependence on foreign energy sources. Earlier this year, GasAmerica began carrying B10, a blend of 10 percent biodiesel and 90 percent No. 2 petroleum diesel. This is the first truck stop to offer a biodiesel blend to truck drivers traveling across Indiana on interstate

70. Lugar stated: "We are celebrating because this is the very first B10 pump in our state. My hope is that it marks the beginning of a movement to give Hoosiers more options at the pump," said Lugar. "The opening of this B10 pump as well as the recent addition of seven E85 pumps at GasAmerica locations is significant progress in furthering the availability of biofuels. "There are now more than 90 E85 pumps in Indiana, hopefully with more to come."
